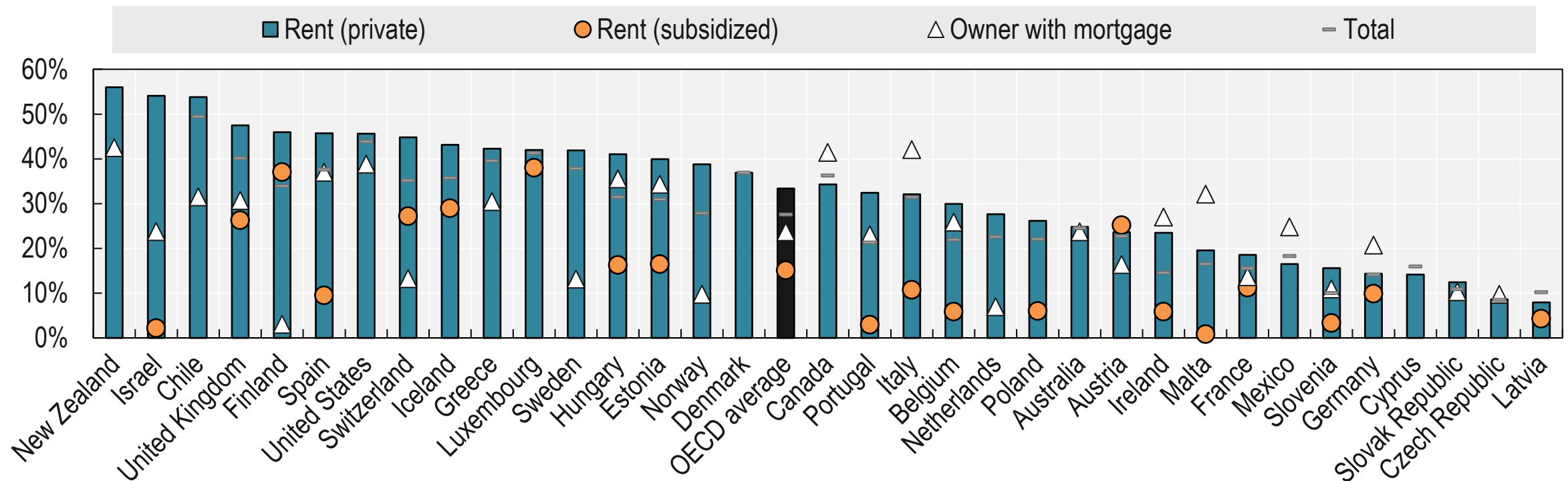
THE CONTEXT: HOUSING AFFORDABILITY CHALLENGES AND POLICY RESPONSES



Many low-income households – especially renters – spend over 40% of disposable income on housing costs.

Housing cost overburden rate among low-income owners (with mortgage) & tenants

Share of population in the bottom quintile of the income distribution spending more than 40% of disposable income on mortgage and rent, by tenure, in percent, 2019 or latest year available



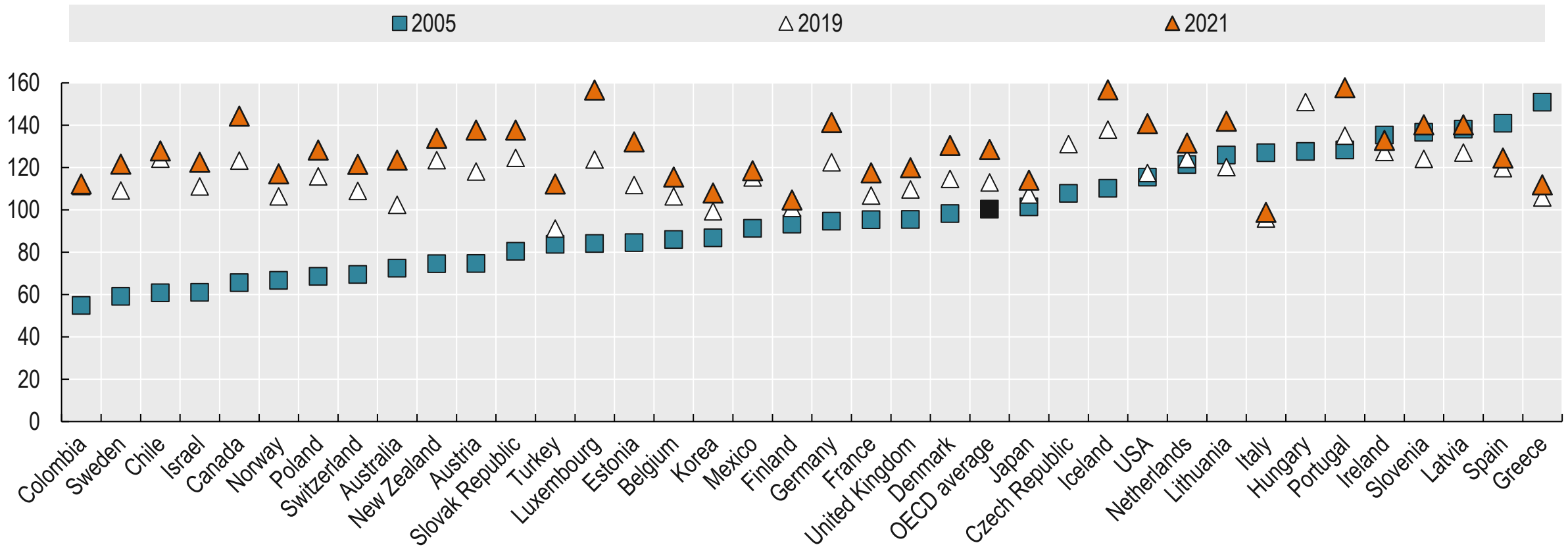
Note: In Chile, Mexico, Korea and the United States gross income instead of disposable income is used due to data limitations. No data on mortgage principal repayments available for Denmark due to data limitations. No data available on subsidized rent in Australia, Canada, Chile, Mexico and the United States. In the Netherlands, Denmark and Sweden tenants at subsidized rate are subsumed into the private market rent category due to data limitations. Real house price index

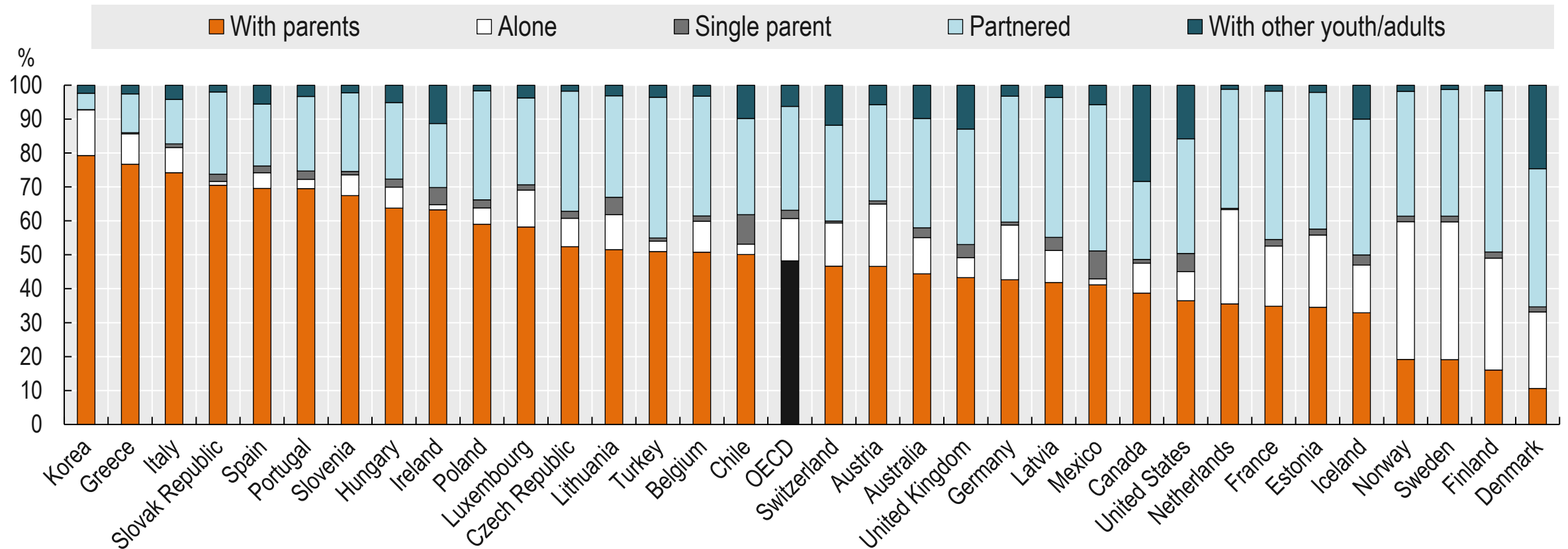
2005, 2019 and 2021, 2015=100

Household composition, by type, among young people aged 20 to 29 years old in percent, 2019 or latest available year

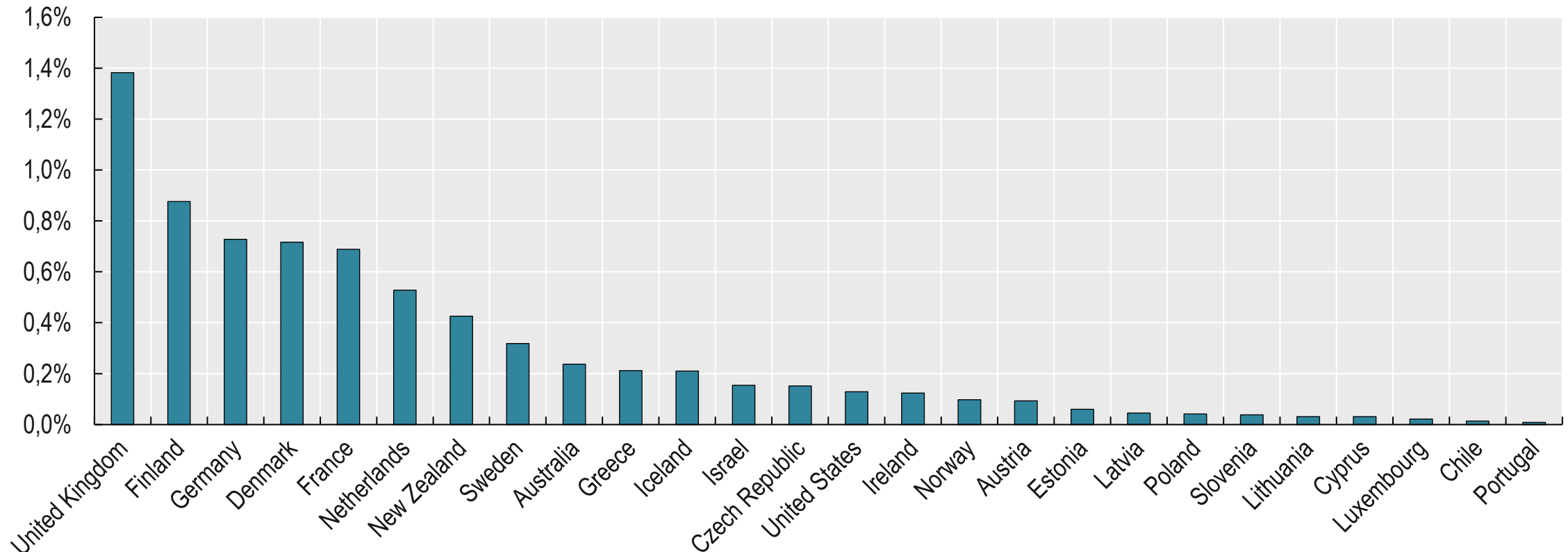




Housing allowances are widespread, though public spending on these supports varies across countries.

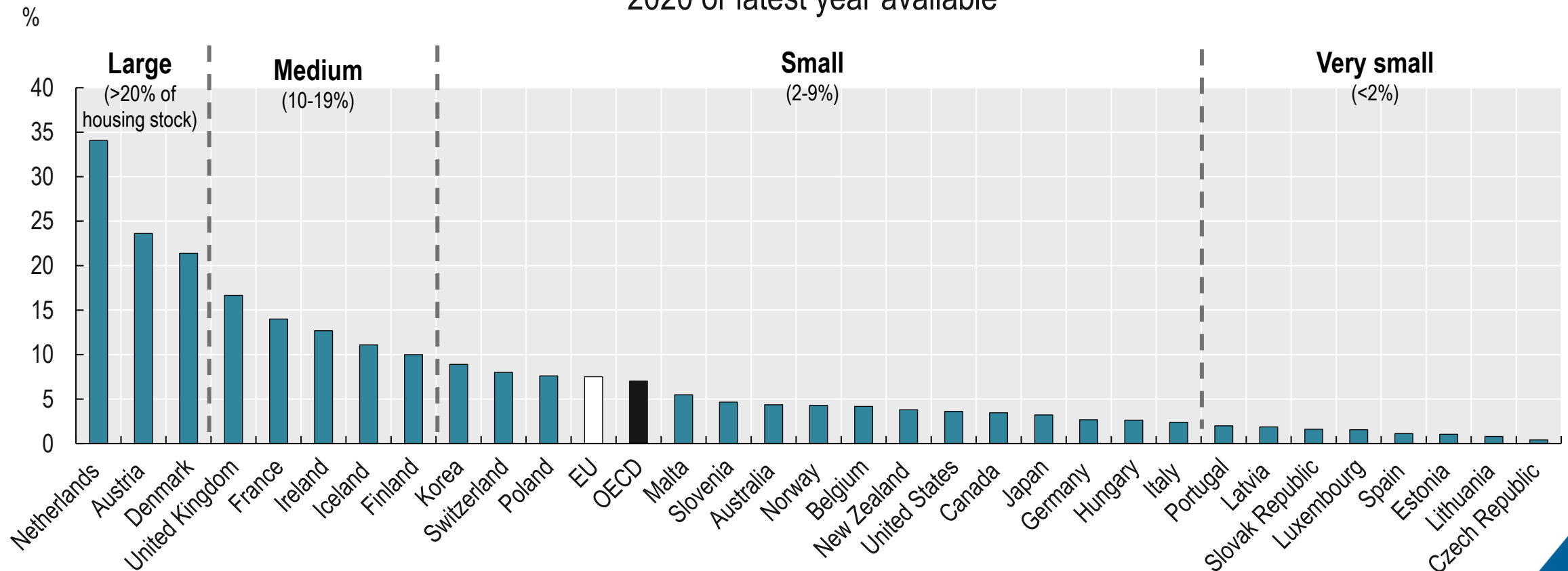

2020 or latest year available

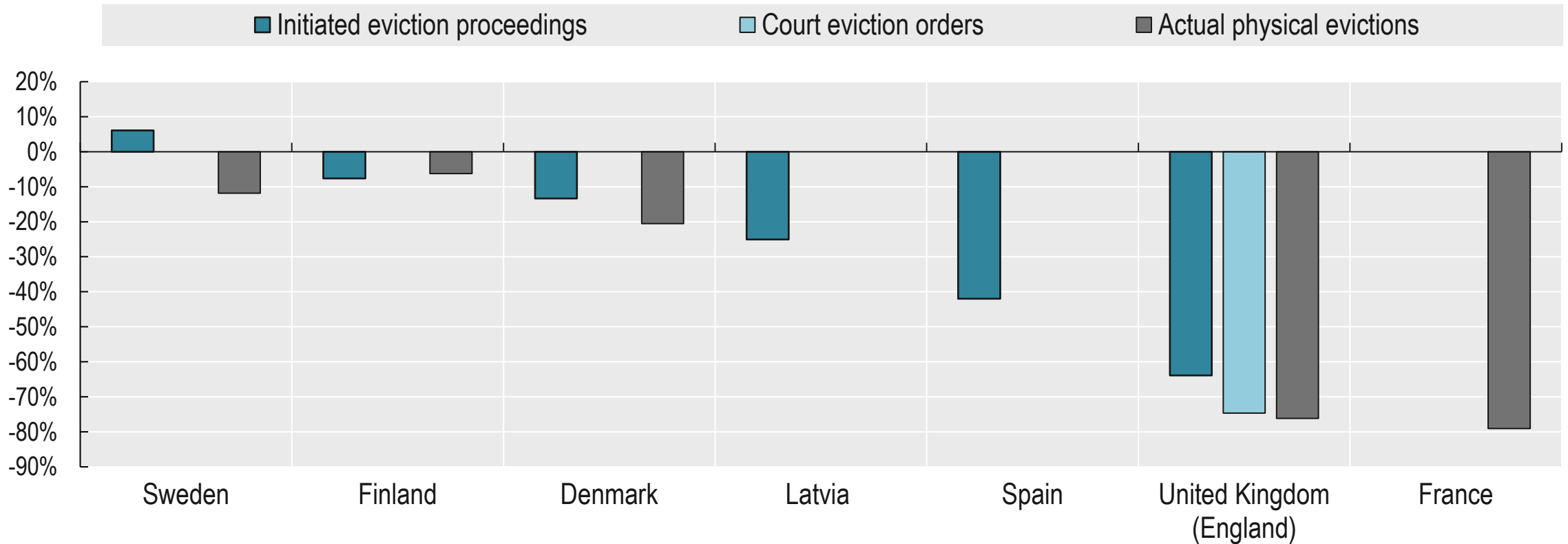




Government interventions at the onset of COVID resulted in a large decline in evictions relative to pre-COVID eviction rates.

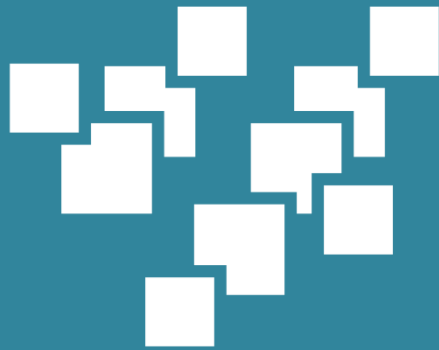

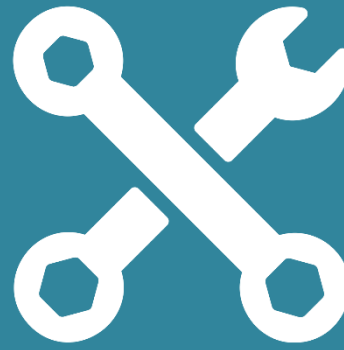

to help governments develop effective homeless strategies

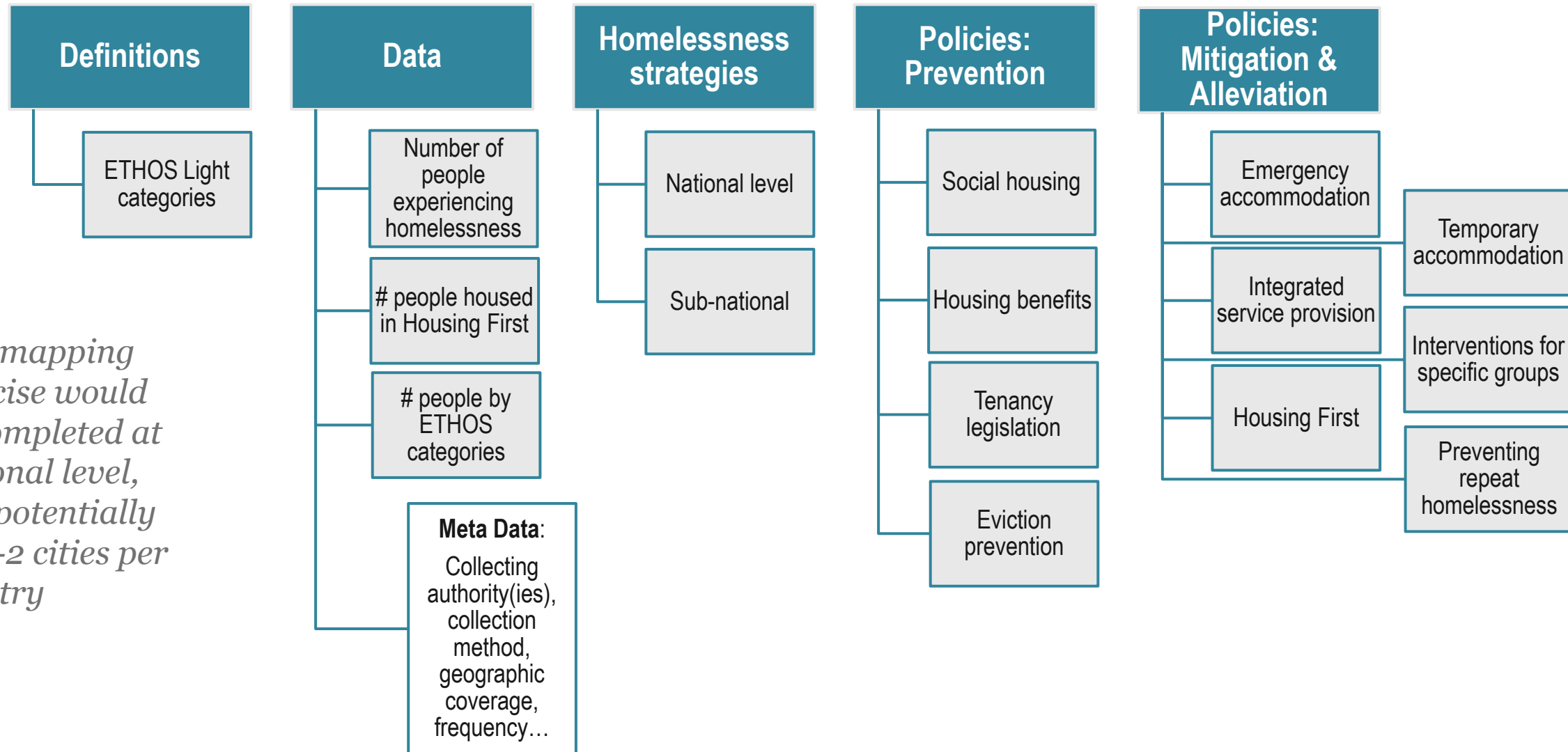
Monitoring framework
